A recent survey shows that America has a new favorite pastime: football. The Pew Research Center asked twelve-thousand people, "If you had to choose one sport as being 'America's sport,' even if you don't personally follow it, which sport would it be?" More than half of respondents chose football, which took the top spot across every demographic, including race, age, and gender. The next most popular response was baseball, picked by 27% of people asked, while less than 10% chose basketball, soccer, car racing, or hockey, respectively.

Think of a poll question that you would like to ask about your hometown, state, a country; for instance, the animal, flower, or food they consider the most representative. Design a survey to capture responses. Then, give the survey to as many people as possible. Be sure to try to capture responses from people of many ages, races, and genders. Tourists visiting Hawaii may soon face a new fee: a 25-dollar climate tax. If Hawaii's government passes the tax, the state will use the funds to preserve the state's beaches and prevent wildfires. Hawaii's new measure would not be the first of its kind. Popular vacation destinations around the world such as Greece, Italy, the Galapagos Islands, and New Zealand require visitors to pay similar fees, ranging from one dollar to one hundred dollars.

Plant lovers in the U.S. have something new to add to their gardens: glow-in-the-dark plants. Geneticists have modified a petunia plant to have a quality known as bioluminescence, which is common in fireflies, marine life, and some mushrooms. The scientists got the petunias to 'light up' by transferring four genes from bioluminescent mushrooms. The Department of Agriculture deemed the plants safe, and they are now available for purchase.
